5. **Committee Reports**

a. **Chair’s Report**— Jon shared a report by the SSDAC about the barriers and recommendations by the SSDAC. The Committee will discuss it during Committee Business.

a. DDS Implementation Update – Silvia Haro

i. DDS Implementation Funding update-no news since last month.

ii. SDP Newsletter & DDS directives – none reported

b. NLACRC Implementation update – Jesse Weller

i. NLACRC Communication procedures- The newsletter is ready to go out to participants.

ii. NLACRC Orientation meetings for new participants – Orientations were held in September and are scheduled in October in both English and Spanish. Informational meetings have been very well attended.

7. Participant Successes and Challenges – Tamra Pauly, who is an independent facilitator, reported that her clients are still “stuck” in the budget process. She received communication yesterday that there has been some movement. Claudia Wenger reported that she has 4 clients in process. A couple of them are in action; two of them are not progressing. She is not clear on what NLACRC needs from them before moving forward. Silvia said she would reach out to both of them. Richard Dier shared that his son has almost 6 months in SDP. He said that initially they were with Premier as FMS but it was not economically viable for Premier because his son’s program is very involved and Premier was taking on a lot of risk. He moved to sole employer model with GT Independence. He feels that this new framework will be very successful for his son. He has not been able to find an insurance company to cover his son as an employer. He wanted to hire someone who is very qualified but the statute requires that he gets an FBI clearance but he can’t get it.

8. **Committee Business**

a. Update on Self Determination Resource Fair – Jon reported that the current plan is to hold a simple resource fair with 4 breakout rooms. Possible breakout topics include FMS, Person Centered planning, what an IF does, what an FMS does. A tentative date in October was discussed, possibly October 30 or 31, or Nov 1 at 11:00am. Various dates and times were discussed. Christina and Jordan also volunteered.

b. Implementation Funding and report – Dr. Weller discussed the implementation funding. This will be a topic at our next meeting as well.

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- c. HCBA Waiver – Home and Community Based Alternatives Waiver – aka nursing waiver for people who require nursing services. Christina described it for us. A consumer can only be on one Federal waiver at a time. Under HCBA waiver, how can we fund nursing services for them? Christina has gotten a few different answers. Nursing is a generic service so SDP cannot pay for nursing until generic services are exhausted. If the nurse becomes an independent nurse provider under Medi-Cal, rather than nursing through an agency, they can be paid under SDP. Dr. Weller said participants can stay in SDP and HCBA waiver.  - d. Agenda planning-review implementation funding plan and work on prioritizing these items and outlining the training. Dr. Weller will share some plans that other RCs or Committees are doing. Review delays in implementing SDP including timely payment to IFs.
9. **Public Input & Comments**— Christina recommended the Disability Voices SDP Connect webinars. They are all recorded so that you can watch them later. One discussion topic was that there is no timeline for approving spending plans, for example. Ken Currie said he is concerned that some Independent Facilitators have not been paid and he is concerned that they won't be able to continue.
