The meeting opened with **OCRA Presentation on Moving Into the Community** – Erica Rodriguez Clients' Rights Advocate with OCRA gave the presentation.

1. Call to Order & Introductions

- A. Committee Chair and Board of Trustees President, Juan Hernandez called the meeting to order at 3:10pm.
- B. Juan Hernandez read the civility code and started introductions.

2. Agenda

5. Committee Business

- A. OCRA Presentation on Moving Into the Community Erica Rodriguez Erica Rodriguez and Natima Nelly gave this presentation at the start of the meeting.
- B. <u>Update on CAC Marketing Campaign</u> Chris Whitlock Chris Whitlock presented an update on the CAC Marketing Campaign. Public Information is still waiting to receive all the photo release forms. A sample was presented to the committee members, explaining that an actual image would be used along with the same quotes. The information will be spread using multiple methods including emails, printed flyers, and the lobby loops.
- C. <u>Update on Communication to Consumers</u> Chris Whitlock Chris Whitlock shared an update on communication to consumers. Public Information is currently working on gathering all the information from consumers regarding their preferences on physical mailers, digital communications, and presented options with different platforms.

Committee Chair, Juan Hernandez, asked for elaboration on these different platforms. Chris Whitlock explained that this is a CRM for individuals to set their preferences for physical or digital forms of communication to ensure proper delivery to members of the community. Digital communication can be tracked, and the progress can be monitored. Also, a QR code was suggested as a way to track the physical mailers.

D. <u>NLACRC Local Delegation Team</u> – Belinda Abatesi

Belinda Abatesi noted that the local grassroots delegation team has been actively engaged in advocacy efforts. On April 14th and 17th the team met with Assemblyman Lackey and Assemblywoman Schiavo to advocate for policies supporting individuals with developmental disabilities, their families, and service providers. During these events, the team was able to raise concerns around workforce shortages and service access funding gaps. Belinda Abatesi noted that during the NLACRC office visits with Assemblyman Lackey and Assemblywoman Schiavo, NLACRC Executive Director, Angela Pao-Johnson engaged in meaningful conversation, exploring the legislative issues impacting the community both locally and across the state. The podcast episodes on these conversations are available on the NLACRC YouTube channel for anyone interested.

E. Community Events Update - Belinda Abatesi

Belinda Abatesi shared an update on upcoming community events, including the Supported Life Institute 29th Annual California Statewide Self-Advocacy Conference on Friday May 9th through Saturday May 10th. The times are from 9:00 am to 8:00pm on Friday and 9:00am to 3:45pm on Saturday. The location and registration link were shared for anyone interested in attending. VICA will

be having a Government Affairs Committee meeting on Wednesday, May 21st from 12:00pm-2:00pm. The location is still to be determined. On May 28th, Wednesday, VICA will also have a Congressional Breakfast for those interested in attending. The registration links for both events were provided for those interested in attending. The Legislative Breakfast will be held on June 27th from 9:00am-11:30am. The event will soon be announced on NLACRC's social media platforms and website. There will be a formal registration process. Space is limited, so Belinda Abatesi asked that committee members please keep an eye out for the announcement.

F. May Revise – Belinda Abatesi

Belinda Abatesi announced that the May Revise is expected to be released by May 14th. The update serves as a revision to the initial budget proposal, which was released in January and reflects the State's latest revenue projections following the April tax filing deadline. The May revision outlines updated funding proposals across key areas, such as medical, education, infrastructure, and services for individuals with developmental disabilities. It also helps as a guide for final budget negotiations for legislators before the June 15th Congressional deadline to pass the state budget. Links were provided in the meeting packet for those interested in more detailed information and updates.

Jose Rodriguez asked who the individual would be to handle information on the budget. Chris Whitlock said that Belinda Abatesi would be handling this moving forward.

G. <u>Update on NLACRC Call Directory System</u> – Angela Pao-Johnson Angela Pao-Johnson gave an update on the NLACRC Call Directory System with increased efforts to enhance NLACRC's responsiveness. Currently, NLACRC is exploring different methods to address this including a potential ticketing system. Also, NLACRC is exploring potentially having just one number to avoid confusion when routing calls. More updates will come in the months ahead.

H. CAC Chair Report - Juan Hernandez

Juan Hernandez provided the committee with an update from the previous Board of Trustees meeting. The Administrative Affairs and Executive Committees will now be stacked and meet on the last Thursday of every month. NLACRC's revised Bylaws were sent up to DDS for approval before being finalized.

I. <u>CAC Training Calendar</u> – Jose Rodriguez Jose Rodriguez presented the CAC Training Calendar with the upcoming OCRA training.

Community and Legislative Educator Report May 2025

Governor Newsom's May Revision 2025-26

Governor Newsom's 2025-26 May Revision outlines significant General Fund reductions across Health and Human Services in response to the state's projected **\$27.6 billion deficit**. Several proposed actions directly affect individuals with developmental disabilities, Regional Centers, and the vendor community.

Department of Developmental Services (DDS):

- **\$221.7M ongoing cut (starting 2026-27):** Providers must comply with EVV, audits, and HCBS rules to qualify for quality incentive payments.
- \$75M reduction in 2025-26: Ends rate reform hold harmless four months early (February 2026).
- **Self-Determination Program:** Reduced by \$22.5M in 2025-26, and \$45.5M ongoing due to cost quardrails.
- Eliminates DSP Workforce Training Program: \$36.8M ongoing cut to the unimplemented Direct Support Professional training initiative.
- Elimination of targeted supports:
 - \$5.6M for implicit bias training refresh
 - \$3M for health & safety waiver assistance
- Porterville Developmental Center: \$10M ongoing reduction starting 2026-27 based on historical savings.
- Cost Recovery and Reimbursement: DDS will pursue increased reimbursements and service cost recovery (savings TBD).

DDS Investments:

- \$13.3M in FY2025-26 for the Life Outcomes Improvement System (LOIS) to support continued planning efforts, including 17 limited-term DDS positions and regional center resources.
- \$1.9M in FY2025-26 for federal HCBS Access Rule compliance, including 9 limited-term positions to manage increased regulatory workload.
- \$1.4M in FY2025-26, increasing to \$2M ongoing, for health and safety investigations and due process caseloads, supporting 9 new permanent positions.
- \$680K in FY2025-26 for clinical monitoring of specialized community homes, with 4 new permanent positions.
- \$1.3M in FY2025-26 to support cost recovery and reimbursement efforts, including 5 permanent positions and external consultant support.

Department of Health Care Services (Medi-Cal):

• Freezes Medi-Cal enrollment for adults (19+) with unsatisfactory immigration status (UIS) – \$86.5M in 2025-26, growing to \$3.3B by 2028-29

- Eliminates long-term care and dental for UIS adults Over \$600M in annual savings by 2028
- \$100 monthly premiums for certain Medi-Cal adults starting 2027 \$2.1B by 2028-29
- Reinstates asset test (\$2,000 individual / \$3,000 couple) \$791M ongoing
- Cuts to FQHCs, Prop 56 payments, and weight-loss drug coverage
- Prescription cost controls via **rebates**, **step therapy**, and prior authorization are projected to save **\$200 million** in 2025-26 and **\$400 million annually thereafter**

In-Home Supportive Services:

- Caps provider Overtime/travel to **50 hours/week \$707.5M ongoing savings**
- Aligns IHSS Residual Program with Medi-Cal timing effectively eliminates the program
- Eliminates IHSS eligibility for adults 19+ with UIS \$158.8M ongoing
- Shifts reassessment penalties to counties \$81M savings
- Conforms IHSS to Medi-Cal asset test \$25.5M in 2025-26

Next Steps:

The Legislature will finalize the budget by **June 15, 2025**. NLACRC will continue to monitor outcomes and advocate to protect access and quality of services for individuals with developmental disabilities and our provider community.

Federal Update: House Passes Budget Bill Cutting Medicaid & SNAP

On May 22, 2025, the U.S. House of Representatives passed a budget reconciliation bill that proposes historic cuts to **Medicaid and the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program** (**SNAP**)—critical programs supporting millions of people with disabilities.

Key Provisions in the House Bill:

- \$715 billion cut to Medicaid, threatening access to Medi-Cal, regional center services, IHSS, early intervention, and more.
- 13.7 million people are projected to lose health insurance due to combined cuts and policy changes.
- \$300 billion cut to SNAP (CalFresh), the largest in program history.
- Increased administrative barriers including biannual Medicaid eligibility renewals.
- New strict work requirements aimed at reducing enrollment.

Action Needed:
