PROJECT OVERVIEW

The Community Services Department of the North Los Angeles County Regional Center (NLACRC) is releasing this Request for Vendorization (RFV) to seek qualified and experienced vendors to provide combined to provide combined day program and behavioral services to individuals with intermediate to complex service needs, including mild to moderate developmental disabilities as well as mental health and/or behavioral diagnosis. The provider will assist with the acquisition, retention, or improvement of self-help, socialization and adaptive skills through the assessment, design, and implementation of behavior modification plans in an effort to produce socially significant improvements in the individual behavior while in the community.

The Program will be based in NLACRC's catchment area. The identified need within NLACRC's catchment area. This service will need to offer innovative ways to provide work supports and/or other valued and productive activities. Participants in the program may exhibit unique challenges such as behaviors necessitating a qualified specialist. This combination of services my include a traditional Behavior Modification Program (532)

INDIVIDUALS TO BE SERVED

This service will be provided to individuals ages 21 and over who have a goal of participating and integrating into the community and/or the acquisition self-help, socialization, and adaptive skills. Individuals being served may present with any combination of the following: a qualifying regional center diagnosis, mental health diagnosis, court involvement, substance abuse, medical issues, or emotional dysregulation associated with aggressive or assaultive behaviors who require specialized services, as deemed necessary based on informed clinical opinion, including review by a regional center clinician. These services must be identified in the Individual Program Plan. Individuals being served may present with any combination of the following: a qualifying regional center diagnosis, mental health diagnosis, court involvement, substance abuse, medical issues, or emotional dysregulation associated with aggressive or assaultive behaviors
